

Easter Drama: *Gamaliel's Journey:* the story of one man's encounter with Jesus Christ.

This 45 minute drama is the fictional story about a Jewish teacher named Gamaliel, who becomes convinced of the Lordship of Jesus through a long and troublesome lifejourney.
