Keeping connected during the Summer!

Summer months are here and as things slow down in church activities, how do you keep connected while you take a break?

Below is an idea that worked for a church in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Using "**The Prophets**" as their topic, they made a booklet with a one-page outline for each. These were stapled to a sheet on which 3 summer fellowship events were announced. Each page had the scripture text, a few short questions pertaining to the text, an idea for a response and a short prayer. (See samples below.)

Scripture:	Jeremiah 1:4-10
Questions:	What is a prophet? Are there prophets today? How long haS God known us? Are we all called by God to do something? What?
Response:	Go for a quiet walk; listen to God in nature.
Prayers:	Thank God for knowing us and being with us. Ask God for patience to listen for His call.

The Prophets & Politics

Scripture:	Amos 2:4-8
Questions:	Why was God angry with Judah and Israel? Is Canada a good place to live? Why? Many children in Canada do not have enough to eat. How should the Government respond to this?
Response:	Write a letter to the government about Canada's involvement in national and international policies.
Prayers:	Thank God for the good things in our country. Pray for the leaders of our country. Pray for those persons whom our country treats unfairly.

To Whom do	we Listen?
Scripture:	Jeremiah 29:29-32
Questions:	How do we make decisions? Tell about a life decision you made. When people talk about God, how do we know what is false or true? Do our actions or words lead people to "trust in a lie" about God?
Response:	What does Jesus say? Read Matthew 5-7.
Prayers:	Pray that our words and actions give true messages about God. Ask for forgiveness where we have failed in this area. Pray for Christian leaders, that they remember to listen to God
