
The Art of Teaching the Bible: A Practical Guide for Adults

by Andrew Root, Baker Publishing Group, 2010.






The Naked Now:

The Spirit and Culture of Youth Ministry: Leading congregations toward exemplary youth ministry



Unleashing the Word: Rediscovering the Public Reading of Scripture


