# Palm Sunday: Hoping in the Twilight

### WE PREPARE TO WORSHIP

### **Prelude & Processional**

HWB #667:

- Have children run down the aisles (on the right and left), waving a palm branch and shouting "he's coming!" lines (#1, #2, #4, #5, #7)
- Have voices from various places in the congregation call out lines #3, #6, #8, #9, and #10 (different individuals) and altogether (children and voices) call out line #11

# **Invitation to Worship & Welcome**

We gather together in the growing darkness of our lives In hope of your kingdom coming, Redeeming our darkening world:
Bringing good news to the poor, Releasing the captives, Giving sight to the blind, And freedom to the oppressed. In remembrance of the hope Offered by your humble entry Into the city of Jerusalem, We gather in the twilight, Sensing the pain and brokenness around us, To proclaim your reign And worship you.

#### **Announcements**

 Announcements are positioned here clearly to be a part of giving all of our lives to God – be sure to emphasize this as part of the service, not something that needs to fit in somewhere (ie. Short prayer/comment: May God bless these and all our activities in our church, homes, and communities this week)

### Offering

- Invite children to bring palm branches from processional to the front at this time.
- Lay them at the base of a display of lit candles, and symbols of the "twilight" around us: newspaper clippings, symbols of violence, on a dark blue cloth (symbols should be relevant to community and context)
- Music should be chosen according to theme as well (ie: works like Bach's Prelude & Fugue in F# major BWV 858; Chopin's Trois nouvelles etudes, No. 3, Poulenc's Novelette in C Major, No. 1 might be appropriate)

#### Sharing

- Invite spontaneous sharing from the congregation
- Ask two or three people to prepare some experience of hope in their lives to share (very briefly), especially if congregation is not given to sharing freely very often

### **Prayer of Confession**

- Bring to God the concerns and praises brought up in sharing, or relevant to the congregation at this time
- Between each, invite the congregational response "Lord, hear our prayer"
- End in unison with HWB #702

- for each verse, project images that fit the verse (ie.: noise, need, toil, multitudes, hearts of pain, God's loves)

# Maundy Thursday: Reflecting in the Night

#### WE PREPARE TO WORSHIP

#### Prelude

- Invite congregational members to enter silently and to join in the singing as they feel comfortable
- Select various people for congregation to bring in hand towels and soap
- Have instrumental group (strings and lighter instruments) and singing group singing Come and fill our hearts (from Taize song collections)

## **Invitation to Worship & Welcome**

We gather together in the darkness
In hope of your kingdom coming,
In reflection of your works of redemption in our lives:
Humbling yourself
Teaching us to be humble
Serving us
And teaching us to serve.
In remembrance of the peace
Demonstrated by your love
At the Last Supper with your disciples,
We gather in the night,
Feeling the selfishness and hate in our world,
To experience your peace
And worship you.

# **Congregational Singing**

HWB #464 Let the hungry come to me
Vv 1-3 – soloist; congregation joins for v.4, 5

HWB #461 In the quiet consecration

#### WE BRING OUR LIVES TO GOD

### Offering & Meditation

- Invite people with towels and soap to bring them to the front at this time
- Lay them at the base of a display of a basin of water, and symbols of the communion table around us: one loaf of bread, one cup, on a black cloth (display should be simple and uncluttered)
- Music should be chosen according to theme as well (ie: works like Brahms' Intermezzo, op. 116, no. 6; Maurice Dela's Hommage; Prokofiev's Vision Fugitives, Op. 22, No. 7 or 8 might be appropriate)

## Sharing

 Ask four people (child, teen, adult, senior) to prepare some experience of community in their lives to share (very briefly)

# **Prayer of Confession**

- Bring to God the concerns and praises relevant to the congregation at this time
- Between each, invite the congregation response "Lord, hear our prayer"
- End in unison with HWB #702

- Solo or small group singing HWB #7 Here, O Lord, your servants gather
- After v.1, invite congregation to form a circle around the sanctuary, holding hands

### **Scripture**

John 13:1-20

### Meditation #2

- Invite people to wash each other's hands (one at a time, around the circle.

  Once finished, people receive the bread and cup and then return to their seats).
- HWB #247 (x5) Jesus, remember me (during hand washing)
- After all hands have been washed, and everyone has received the bread and cup, soloist sings again HWB #464 Let the hungry come to me (v. 1&2) and eat and drink together

#### WE PREPARE TO WORSHIP

#### **Prelude**

- Invite congregational members to enter silently
- Select various people for congregation to bring in various styles and sizes of crosses
- Have no music at this time

## **Invitation to Worship & Welcome**

We gather together in the growing dawn
In hope of your kingdom coming,
In reflection of your works of redemption in our lives,
In the anticipation of your triumph:
Hated at your trial,
Mocked at your death,
Dying on the cross,
Waiting in the grave
In expectation of what we know will come,
Predicted by your words
After Peter's confession,
We gather in the stillness before morning,
Waiting and watching,
To experience your light
And worship you.

# Offering & Meditation

- Invite people with crosses to bring them to the front at this time
- Lay them at the base of a display of a larger wooden cross on a light grey-blue cloth

# **Prayer of Confession**

- Bring to God the concerns and praises relevant to the congregation and context (ie. Good Friday) at this time
- Between each, invite the congregational response "Lord, hear our prayer"
- End in unison with HWB #702

# **Easter Sunday: Rejoicing in the Morning**

#### WE PREPARE TO WORSHIP

# **Prelude & Processional**

HWB #256 Sing, my tongue, the song:

- Soloist sing v. 1,2,3
- During this time, several people process to the front and lay flowers at the base of a cross, with the dark blue, black, and light blue-gray cloths draped around it, and a picture or bowl or drinking water beside it
- Other singers lay flowers at cross and join soloist in v. 4,5,6

### **Invitation to Worship & Welcome**

We gather together in the beauty of the morning In hope of your kingdom coming, In reflection of your works of redemption in our lives, In the anticipation of your triumph, And in the overwhelming joy of your resurrection!

You bring good news to the poor You release the captives, You give sight to the blind, Freedom to the oppressed And you proclaim the reign of God over even death!

In remembrance of the Word made flesh Causing turmoil and confusion By letting evil do its worst All to transform God's creation In the ecstasy of love, We gather in the morning, Celebrating the knowledge of your truth, To proclaim your reign over all And worship you.

# **Congregational Singing**

HWB #260 When I survey the wondrous cross

HWB #273 Low in the grave he lay

• Until the refrain of this song, the service has remained anticipatory, try using instruments (not too militaristic sounding, though: conga drum, fiddle, flute, clarinet, piano, no organ!) and keep the tempo lively (at least for the refrain).

#### WE BRING OUR LIVES TO GOD

### Offering

- Invite children to bring to the cross yellow & orange colored cloths
- Throw the other cloths aside (but not away leave as a "frame" to the bright colored cloth) and invite children to hang bright cloths on/around the cross

- Invite spontaneous sharing from the congregation
- Ask two or three people to prepare some experience of joy in their lives to share (very briefly)

# **Prayer of Confession**

- Bring to god the concerns and praises brought up in sharing, or relevant to the congregation at this time
- Between each, invite the congregational response "Lord, hear our prayer"
- End in unison with HWB #702

# **Congregational Singing**

### **Meditation #1**

- Small group and instrumentalist read, then sing HWB #222 How brightly beams the morning star
- Show images of morning and joy (ie: nature, children, people, colors, designs, etc.)
- Read in Thy Hand; "In Thy Hand," reprinted from Messages from Time to Time:
   A book Celebrating the Fortieth Wedding Anniversary of Masao and Fumiko
   Takenaka

#### Meditation #2

# **Scripture**

#### Meditation #3

- Display visual of Ode to Joy by He Qi, China; see Gifts of Many Cultures, p.
   220
- Join hands in circle around the sanctuary, while singing HWB #101 *Alleluia*, come offer each other cups of water dipped in the bowl *(or use dipper).*
