





by Nicholas Thomas Wrigbt, Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, 2011.


Each daily lectionary passage for Lent/Easter is followed by a reflection and prayer that will help readers to ponder the relevance of Matthew's Gospel for their own lives.

by Lisa Smith; Meredith Egan, Mennonite Central Committee, 2010.



by Donald G. Friesen, Edge Hill Home Enterprises, 2011.


A collection of sermons moulded in the nation's capital where he has pastored for over three decades. These meditations convey an ecumenical spirit as well as a sense of humour.



by David M. Csinos, Wipf and Stock, 2011.


Affirms children's encounter with God and explores four spiritual styles of that spirituality and faith (word, emotion, symbol, action).
