A powerful autobiography of one man's struggle to overcome alcohol addiction with the help of the spiritual teachings and the healing love of his elders.




Caring for Mother: A Daughter's Long Goodbye

Sometimes affirming, sometimes controversial but always contemporary, these short reflections represent the prickly interface between faith and politics from the perspective of a Christian believer.


