

by Sallie McFaque, Augsburg Fortress, 2013.



by Anne Richards, SPCK, 2013.


She argues that children are not only deeply woven into God's purposes but are also makers of God's story, "providers to us of a language through which God's will for the creation is revealed."

DVD by Ronald Rolheiser, Oblate Media, 2011.




Jean Vanier - Our Life Together: A Memoir in Letters




Her own goal is simple: to inspire and equip clergy to make changes that will enhance the transformative power of their preaching.


<u>Subversive Wisdom: Sociopolitical Dimensions</u> of John's Gospel




