
Drawing from his own journey, Hatmaker proves to readers that serving the least is not a trendy act of benevolence but a lifestyle of authentic community and spiritual transformation.


Why not a roving, eclectic dictionary that is both ridiculously current and particular, and at the same time broadly inclusive, reaching back to Augustine and St. Benedict?

by Sue Clemmer Steiner, 2013.






Offers inspiration and practical tools to youth leaders who want to develop and deepen their youth ministry, both for themselves and for the youth to whom they minister.


Mothering Mennonite



by Mark Pierson, Sparkhouse Press, 2012.


Promotes a new vocabulary to help worship curators work out how and why and where worship can best engage their community, inside and outside the church, in transformative encounters with God.

by Theresa F. Latini, Eerdmans, 2011.




