by Ervin R. Stutzman, 2013.


This book invites congregations to learn communal forms of biblical interpretation through which to implement discernment practices guiding us through today's challenging ethical and theological riddles.


A splendid and eloquent story of the work of MCC in Canada from its beginnings in the 1920s to the present.


## Strangers at My Door: An Experiment in Radical Hospitality





#### The F word: Stories of Forgiveness




