

Filled with compelling stories and photos, Iraq war veteran Mehl-Laituri creates an almanac of soldier saints and patriot pacifists from the front lines of church history.





by <u>Cleve Persinger</u>, CreateSpace Independent Publishing Platform, 2013.


This booklet includes 19 essays on church communication, covering basic strategy and practical, real world tips for churches that want to be "dangerous."

ed. Neil Paynter, Wild Goose Publications, 2013.







by Karl Lehman, This Joy Books, 2011.



<u>Saying Goodbye: Resources for Funerals,</u> <u>Scattering Ashes And Remembering</u>




<u>Understanding White Privilege: Creating</u> <u>Pathways to Authentic Relationships Across Race</u>


