Making Change





by Donna Jackson Nakazawa, Da Capo Press, 2004.



by Alexia Salvatierra; Peter Heltzel, InterVarsity Press, 2014.


This model of "faith-rooted organizing" offers a path to meaningful social change that takes seriously the command to love God and to love our neighbour as ourself.

by Paul Alexander; Al Tizon, Regnum Books, 2013.


This book honours Ron Sider, by bringing together a group of scholar-activists, old and young, to reflect upon the gospel and its radical implications for the 21st century.



DVD by Sybil MacBeth and Andy MacBeth, Paraclete Press, 2012.


An effective way to equip men to discover their call to pray together. Leading different prayer exercises, Andy addresses the problems men face and barriers that keep them from praying as a group.

by David E. Fitch; Geoff Holsclaw, Jossey-Bass, 2013.


Offers a down-to-earth, accessible, and yet provocative understanding of God's mission of redemption in the world, and how followers of Christ can participate in this work.

Weaver argues that since God is revealed in Jesus, the nonviolence of Jesus most truly reflects the character of God. The way Christians live - Christian ethics - is an ongoing expression of theology. Consequently, he suggests positive images of the reign of God made visible in the narrative of Jesus - nonviolent practice, forgiveness and restorative justice, issues of racism and sexism, and more - in order that Christians might live more peacefully.



Reality, Grief, Hope: Three Urgent Prophetic Tasks

by Walter Brueggemann, Wm. B. Eerdmans, 2014.

Pointing out striking correlations between the catastrophe of 9/11 and the destruction of ancient Jerusalem, Brueggemann shows how the prophetic biblical response to that crisis was truth-telling in the face of ideology, grief in the face of denial, and hope in the face of despair.



What Is Sexting?: Sex + Texting = Sexting

The Thoughtful Christian, 2009.

Provides parents, clergy, and teachers with a foundation for how to help teenagers make sexual decisions in day-to-day life that will also serve to benefit a teen's interactions in cyberspace. This study also takes an unflinching look at the social and legal ramifications of sexting.



Selah's Song: A Social Justice Folk Musical

by <u>Johnny Wideman</u>; <u>Bryan Moyer Suderman</u>, Theatre of the Beat, 2014.

A musical about a young girl whose courage inspires a village, and whose music becomes an anthem for peace. Recently debuted in Stouffville, Ontario with many cast members from Community Mennonite Fellowship.




Wounded Children, Healing Homes: How Traumatized Children Impact Adoptive and Foster Families


