Summertime! Suntime! One in the Son time!

Stay connected as a congregation in the slower, scattered summer months by encouraging folks to reflect on a specific, creation focused scripture text (eg. Psalm 104):

- Writers muse on this text from a congregational blog or website, or keep a word or pictorial journal. Share these musings during a monthly display or storytelling event in your church, Sunday school, fellowship groups, etc.
- **Travelers** post your summer journeys on a map in the church foyer. How does the Psalm 104 "read" from another location?
- Soak in scripture by having all ages memorize sections of Psalm 104 – and present this as part of a special worship service in early fall.
- Put on a summer musical, host a jam session or house concert in your community.
- Educators order the VBS material, Give and Receive God's Great Love (<u>www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/2329</u>) and lead a weekend event for all ages, culminating in Sunday morning worship and a potluck.
- Care for creation by collaborating in a community garden plot and grow produce for the local food bank. Post pictures of the garden on the church website.


Based on the Revised Common Lectionary, the liturgical pieces offer helpful preparation aids for Ordinary Time in Year A.


A liturgy of "pilgrimage" that guides the participants around the places of significance in most churches or worship spaces.


A five-session adult curriculum that explores key topics central to Franciscan theology and practice.


Combining substantive biblical principles, missiological understanding and practical insights, this book highlights the various models and development phases of church planting.

Offers a valuable understanding of mission as ministry of reconciliation.




The Twelve Minor Prophets: Leader's Guide and Participant Handout The Thoughtful Christian, 2013.






