Greetings from the President

It's hard to believe I am into my 4th year as President. At our business meeting, which was held during Mennonite Church Canada's Assembly in Winnipeg on July 4, I was affirmed to continue as President for an additional 2-year term. Our Secretary-Treasurer, Lois Mierau, was also affirmed for another 2-year term. MW Canada's terms of office have changed from 3 years to 2 years since the delegate body of MC Canada now only meets biennially instead of annually. Your words of affirmation and encouragement continue to support all of us on the executive in our volunteer roles.

MW Canada's executive is made up of President, Secretary-Treasurer and a representative from each of the 5 area churches: British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Eastern Canada. We meet for 3 days in early March in Winnipeg during MC Canada's Spring Leadership Assembly and host an event during Assembly to which all women are invited.



This year's event used the Assembly theme "Wild Hope, faith for an unknown season" and was hosted by our Manitoba rep, Elsie Wiebe, and her group of local volunteers. While women enjoyed

dessert and coffee, we held our short business meeting. This was followed by the highlight of our evening - the Faith and Life Women's Chorus and the sharing from three young women on the theme "Wild Hope". A detailed write-up about this event can be found on our blog. (...continued on next page)

The Lord has been good to me and my family and I am grateful."


