

Two Waters, One Source

On October 9, 2014, a group from Winnipeg, Manitoba decided to visit Shoal Lake No.40 First Nation to learn their story. Although their lake is the source of Winnipeg's fresh drinking

water, they have been on a boil water advisory for over 15 years. The First Nation community spends \$240,000 annually to import bottled water. Until three years ago, the only access they had to the mainland was a small barge, or the frozen lake during winter. For the last century, this community has been fighting for a road to solve their forced isolation issue. This "Freedom Road" will make it possible to receive a water treatment plant and allow the community to safely access the mainland.







by Frederick Buechner, Paraclete Press, 2014.




Friends and Peer Pressure: Junior High Group Study






This is a resource book for anyone who is planning a baptism, naming ceremony, wedding or civil partnership, and the celebration of many other significant moments.


Your Faith Will Sustain You And You Will Prevail: The Life Story of Jacob and Elisabeth Isaak
