






Silent Compassion:

Toward an Anabaptist Political Theology: Law, Order, and Civil Society by A. James Reimer, Wipf and Stock Publishers, 2014.

Published posthumously, this is nonetheless Reimer's (1942-2010) theopolitical project, intended to be a fully theologically conceptualized political theology. His thesis focuses on the necessity to take seriously the biblical-Trinitarian foundations for all Christian social ethics, but also on the importance of astute and faithful engagement by Christians in public institutional life, including the political realm.



Health, Healing and the Church's Mission: Biblical Perspectives and Moral Priorities by Willard M. Swartley, InterVarsity Press, 2012.

Swartley draws together biblical, historical and moral perspectives to help all Christians, including those in health care professions, respond to our current health care challenges. His conclusions will encourage, enlighten and, quite possibly, surprise readers.


