MHC Gallery is pleased to host the Manitoba Society of Artists 83rd Annual Open Juried Art Exhibition this summer. Each year, MSA invites Manitoba Artists over the age of 16 to submit works for this exhibition.

History of MSA and OJCE:

The Manitoba Society of Artists was established in 1902 originally as an organization to recognize the merits of Manitoba's outstanding artists; to promote and encourage visual artists in Manitoba; and to provide a western equivalent to the Ontario Society of Artists. In addition to showing work by its members, the society campaigned for an art gallery and art school in the province and arranged for touring exhibits from institutions outside Winnipeg such as the Chicago Art Institute.

After going through several periods of organizational change, a new Manitoba Society of Artists emerged in 1925 with an executive consisting of Alex J. Musgrove as Secretary and Walter J. Phillips as President. In 1926, the first annual exhibition was held in the Richardson Brothers Gallery on Main Street in Winnipeg. Since then, except for a few years, the Society has sponsored an annual open juried exhibition in various locations including at the Eaton's and Hudson's Bay Company stores; the Pool of the Black Star Gallery at the Manitoba Legislative Building; the Winnipeg Civic Auditorium; and the Winnipeg Art Gallery. Other programs have included annual juried exhibitions, lectures, art history conferences and other member events.

courage Manitoba's professional and emerging visual arists. Young artists are supported by bursaries to Manitoba art programs. Members of the Society exhibit together, enjoy social events and participate in educational ventures, such as lectures, slide presentations and workshops.

The Annual Open Juried Competition and Exhibition allows emerging and professional art-

About the Awards:

The Lynn Sissons Watercolour Award was established by her family to honour longtime MSA member Lynn Sissons who passed away in 1985. The award is selected by the juror to be given to a work deserving of merit that demonstrates and promotes a traditional use of the medium. Therefore, the award favours works that are more representational than experimental in nature.

The W.Cliff Packer Memorial Award was established in 2000 to honour and celebrate the life and work of Cliff Packer. The intent of the award is to pay homage to Cliff's varied interests as an artist. The theme of the award is "for a work of art deserving of merit in the genre tradition." Genre is a term used to describe paintings and other works of art that deal with an informal representation of everyday life. Genre is not limited to a particular medium, pays particular attention to work involving the human figure, and tends to be representational rather than abstract, in nature.

The Brian J. Hyslop Award for Pastel was established in 2006 to honour and celebrate the life of MSA Board member Brian Hyslop. The intent of the pastel medium award was to encourage artists to demonstrate their skills with original work in pastels. Although Brian favoured landscapes, there was no jury advisory. It is their decision to choose the work of merit as they see fit.

The Barbara Cook Endres Award for First Place was named in 2012 to honour Manitoba artist and long time MSA member Barb Endres, who was an unflagging supporter of the visual arts. Barb joined MSA in 1947, and served in various executive positions continuously until her retirement in 2008. She was designated an honorary member in 2006. Upon her passing in 2010, she left a bequest to MSA which allows a bursary to promising artist students. There is no stipulation attached to this award, it is therefore at the jurors' discretion, the Best of Show.

A free juror's lecture will be held at the gallery on June 27 at 7:30 p.m. This is a wonderful opportunity to come and meet the jurors and learn about them and their selection process.

The Jurors

Debora Cardaci received her Fine Arts degree in 1992. She taught art over 20 years, both in the community and at the University of Arts. Particularly attracted to expressive art and interested in the sense of motion and emotion in a piece of art, her work has been influenced by the studies of many masters, such as Rodin, Kathe Kollwotz, Ilya Repin, Valentine Serov, Joaquin Sorolla, the Impressionists, the Expressionists, and Abstract Expressionists.

An accomplished painter, sculptor, illustrator and designer, she is always finding challenge and joy in experimentation with different media. Her works have been featured in galleries and in private collections in North America, South America, and Europe.

David T Alexander studied at the Vancouver Art School and at Langara College before graduating with a BFA from Notre Dame University. In 1980 he moved to Saskatoon to obtain a Master's degree while researching in New York, London, and Paris. His international exhibitions have allowed him to explore the world and to give lectures along the way.

David Alexander's art is in many public, private, and corporate collections throughout the world. Alexander's signature landscapes and waterscapes called "Wet" represent his significant forty-five year history in painting and drawing with a bold palette and gestural application.

All are invited to visit the lecture and exhibition: enjoy an opportunity to not only view some spectacular artworks, but to meet the artists as well. Entry is free.
