Eternal Life Sunday A Candle-Lighting Memorial Service

- List the names of those who have died between the first and last Sundays of the church year
- Send a letter of intent, information and invitation to the family of the deceased. In the letter, outline the service and its purpose
- The pastor or a pastoral care lay person (e.g., deacon/elder) should lead the service. This service requires careful planning and good emotional energy. It is a personcentred service. The visual, the symbolism and the participation are more important than what is said, and form the essence of the service.

Candle Lighting Ceremony

- The family members of those who had died are seated in the front pews.
- The candle lighting table contains the number of white candles equal to the number of deaths, and one large white candle in front of a cross. This large Christ candle is lit prior to the service.
- The worship leader, at the table, reads the names of the deceased in alphabetical order. Their date of death and age are optional.
- For each name read, the family comes forward and lights a candle in remembrance of the deceased. They light their candle from the Christ candle.
- After all the candles have been lit, light one additional candle to represent all the other losses which we are remembering again from years past.
- Observe a time of silence.
