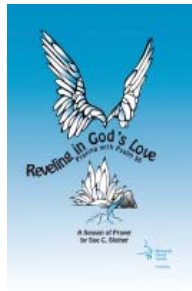

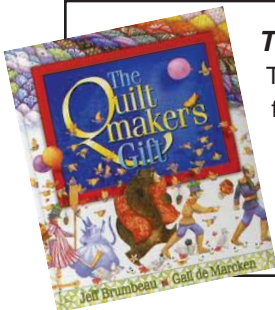


Childrens' Corner

In contrast, the greedy king, his storehouse stuffed with treasures, yearns for something that will make him happy. Does she have a life-changing lesson for him? Beautifully illustrated; the exquisite quilts themselves hold clues to the unfolding story. A wonderful corrective to a consumer-driven Christmas. Sing the Journey: Hymnal: A Worship Book, Supplement 1, Faith and Life Resources, 2005. The hymnal supplement released this summer at the annual assembly in Charlotte, NC.

A Generous Orthodoxy by Brian D. McLaren. Calls for a radical, Christ-centred orthodoxy of faith and practice in a missional, generous spirit.

God's Story, Our Story by Michele Hershberger, Faith and Life Resources, 2003. An introduction to the Christian faith from an Anabaptist perspective.

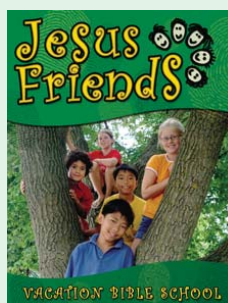

A new five-day curriculum from Mennonite Publishing Network that will teach children how to reach out "across the street and around the world." Daily themes emphasize important ways to become "Jesus

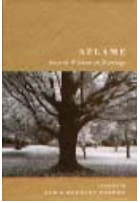

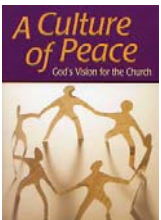

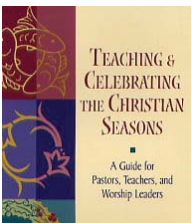
Aflame: Ancient Wisdom on Marriage compiled by Sam and Bethany Torode, William B. Eerdman's, 2005. Featuring beautiful words and photographs alongside each other, "Aflame" offers ancient wisdom on eight aspects of marriage: unity, beauty, harmony, joy, purity, desire, fruitfulness, and fidelity. The eight sections each begin with a Scripture verse, and consist of select excerpts from ancient Christian books, sermons, and wedding liturgies, all drawn from a rich variety of cultures - Greek, Roman, African, Middle Eastern, and Celtic.



A Culture of Peace: God's Vision for the Church, by Alan Kreider, Eleanor Kreider, Paulus Widjaja, Good Books 2005. Why is peace such a divisive issue, even among Christians? Why is peace often considered an extra, rather than an essential, to faithful Christian living? The authors suggest how to develop "peacemaking reflexes"; how churches "can learn to handle conflict well"; and how to cultivate vulnerability and humility, two essential "attitudes of peacemakers."



Hunger No More: Faces behind the Facts, Mennonite Media, 2004. A TV documentary presented by the National Council of Churches takes an unflinching look at the persistent problem of hunger in the 21st century... and offers solutions. Most of us don't often ask where our next meal is coming from. But for millions of North Americans and nearly a billion people worldwide, such food insecurity is a daily reality. This DVD approaches hunger from the perspective of faith, declaring that hunger is more than a social issue. "It is a moral issue that needs immediate resolution. The program brings to life the moral dimension of this thorny issue, and offers up a vision for a new day when hunger is eradicated from the face of the earth."



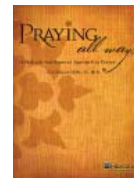
Teaching and Celebrating the Christian Seasons: A Guide for Pastors, Teachers and Worship Leaders, by Delia Halverson, Chalice Press, 2002. Celebrating Christian seasons brings new meaning to our worship and removes the distance between past and present. The cycle of the seasons

keeps Christ in our hearts and minds throughout the year. This spiritually enriching resource helps church leaders understand and incorporate into the life of the church the symbols, colours, and practices of the church year.

Bullying: A Spiritual Crisis by Ronald Hecker Cram, Chalice Press, 2003. Cram examines bullying from a theological/spiritual perspective and identifies it not just as a behavioural issue, but a spiritual crisis. His research includes wrestling with the violence found in the history and traditions of our Judeo-Christian faith and also through conversations with Christian adults who were bullied or had been bullies (often both) as children. He examines the roots of violence and how a societal valuing of tolerance leads to bullying. Cram believes that the opposite of intolerance is not tolerance but empathy.



Praying All Ways: A Multiple Intelligences Approach to Prayer by Caroljean Willie, Harcourt Publishers. The theory of multiple intelligences has revolutionized our understanding of how the human brain functions and has had a phenomenal impact on the field of education. However, this theory also has applications to prayer and worship. Instead of viewing the intelligences simply as pathways to the brain, they can also be indicative of pathways to God. Looking at the intelligences through the lens of prayer opens up a variety of prayer options and possibilities which can lead people into more meaningful forms of prayer and help dissolve language and cultural barriers. A practical guide for personal and congregational use.



Fish Eyes: On Stage, Ted and Lee Comedy, 2001. Brace yourself for a journey through the Gospels like nothing you've ever experienced. Both hilarious and haunting, this Fish-Eyes DVD looks at familiar scriptures through the eyes of Peter and Andrew (Ted and Lee). From a bumper crop of fish to the despair of denial to a jubilant Easter twist, we see these simple fishermen as real people, standing hip-deep in miracles, parables, questions, and ultimately faith. The complete script of this dramatic presentation is also available to peruse.
