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18	2)	Fin	anci	al Update and Discussion (pp 3-9 of docket): Allan presented the financial reports to March	
19		31	and	his Secretary/Treasurer report (e-mailed April 15 morning).

21			i)	A question was raised about the FYE 2021 draft budget contribution amounts from the	
22				Regional Churches and how these were determined.	
23			ii)	Travel expenses for flights that did not happen are on hold as credit towards further travel	
24				plans.	
25			iii)	Workers have been encouraged to keep spending at a bare bones.	
26			iv)	Next Council meeting will have a more comprehensive discussion of the proposed budget	
27				and include last year's budget for comparison and better understanding of effect of COVID

29		b)	Cu	rrent status of bank accounts and Abundance accounts	
30			i)	Allan reviewed the status of MC Canada's bank accounts and Abundance accounts, as of	
31				March 31, 2020, shown in the Secretary/Treasurer report.	
32			ii)	Some of the Abundance accounts are invested in products that have roughly 40% equity and	
33			-	60% fixed income. These accounts had high returns last fiscal year, but have lost value in the	
34				last two month due to market declines.	
35			iii)	These assets are also shown on the new Balance sheet report produced by Sean.	
36		c)		ernally Restricted Fund Consolidation.	
37		•	i)	A Plan for implementing the internally restricted fund consolidations approved at the last	
38				Joint Council meeting, and to increase transparency between IR funds and Abundance	
39				accounts, was outlined in the Secretary/Treasurer report.	

40 ii) Question on which restricted funds are open for use was explained, with Co of 1000 being 41 specific for that program, and Endowments can only use interest, also based on specific 42 programs. FPAC recommends maintaining the current strategy of investment strategy and 43 transferring several funds from W0066C leaving it as a fixed income account only. Interest 44 would return into the bequest fund instead of general budget, as per our updated Financial 45 Polices. 46 47 CONSENSUS: That Joint Council approve the recommendations brought forward from FPAC 48 (documented in the Secretary/Treasurer report) on how to implement the internally restricted 49 fund consolidation process as approved at Joint Council in January. 50 51 d) **Current audit plan** – Allan indicated that the annual audit was slightly delayed due to the 52 current crisis. Due to this delay, the audited Financial Statements may not be ready for the 53 scheduled May 23 Joint Council meeting. An updated schedule will be available in early May. 54 55 3) Naming Priorities (pp 10-11 of docket) : 56 a) Doug provided a number of options regarding staffing and programs of MC Canada in working 57 through priorities during the current COVID-19 crisis. Mandates have varied across the nation, 58 but in Manitoba needed to close the offices, with only finance staff (Jessica) and Doug present in 59 the offices. Other permanent staff are working from home. 60 b) The concern is if regions are feeling the pinch and unable to forward funds, priorities need to be 61 determined. 62 c) 7 options were presented. Calvin led the discussion. d) Feedback and Consensus: As reserve funds are set aside for times of crisis or 'rainy day', this is 63 64 the time to make use of them, therefore consensus is to go with option of keep paying all staff 65 as normal. If we have significant deficit at year-end, we consider it a loss from our reserves. 66 Caution was expressed that should there be a significant drop in revenue as the year progresses, 67 that we seek government assistance funding. Advised to: a) keep communication open and 68 strong to keep up with evolving nature and needs of congregations b) to work hard at finding 69 ways to continue support for Int'l students who were laid off due to offices closing c) to 70 remember our purpose in serving the larger church body, and to be aware of the congregations. 71 72 4) Building Repair (Roof and HVAC) Update: 73 a) Calvin updated Joint Council on the hiring of a project manager for the Conference Building 74 repair, and the next steps in the process. As follow up to Council meeting in January, JC 75 Executive Committee interviewed Eric Friesen of Cool Green Solutions Inc. and recommend 76 hiring Eric to project manage the repair process. The next step is for Eric to have engineering 77 design done, prepare a proposal and estimate for the May meetings. Due to his extensive 78 experience in managing similar projects and familiarity of the MC Canada building, Joint Council 79 Executive will not seek proposals with other vendors. Suggestions from the MC Canada 80 Sustainability Committee on some alternatives for the HVAC update to look at were forwarded 81 to Eric.

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83	5)	Updates on Study Conference and other initiatives: Doug presented some updates.
84		a) Study Conference moving from the plan for a large 2 day event in Baden (Oct 23/24), to a
85		combination of pre-recorded materials and remote live presentations and meeting. If
86		restrictions are lifted somewhat, the hope is for small groups or sites in different regions to
87		meet together (following group size restrictions or recommendations). Another planning
88		meeting will be held on Friday to make final decisions and then to begin work with advertising.
89		b) MDS –exploring and initiative for releasing some reserve funds for congregations that want to
90		respond to impact of COVID in their communities. They are asking if MC Canada would be
91		willing to assist with grant funding as well as helping roll it out. Currently waiting for the
92		proposal.
93		c) AMBS is applying for a grant from the Lilly Foundation for some work around Church Re-
94		vitalization. They were told that we already have some things going in Canada. However
95		AMBS wants to be at 'our service'. A proposal will come if they receive the grant.
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97	6)	Next Meeting: May 23 – Joint Council will meet via ZOOM instead of in-person – with two 2 hours
