

PARTICIPATE

LEARN

- Find a story from International Witness worker newsletters or news releases and share on your church website or e-mail group.
- Use the video and worship resources for International Witness Sunday.
- Post newsletters, Canadian Mennonite articles, or Mennonite Church Canada website stories about international ministries.
- Use your congregation's announcement or sharing time to give news and ask for prayer for international partners and Witness workers.

CONNECT

- Ask a Witness worker to have a Zoom meeting with your mission/service committee members, or your Bible study group.
- Ask an international partner to meet online. Find a translator or ask a Witness worker to help you connect.
- Join a Witness Support Network (see page 8).

DISCUSS & INVEST

 Giving to an international ministry as an investment in the Kingdom of God. We invest in many things: our children's education, our retirement, our homes. How do we invest in the church? Where do we see God's spirit moving and how do we get on board with what God is doing in the world?

TRANSFORM

- Has international ministry changed how you think about your faith and life here in Canada? What can we learn from our international partners?
- Does your community need Peace and Reconciliation (PaR) teams like those formed and trained by Dann and Joji Pantoja in the Philippines?
- Could your community benefit from conflict transformation circles used by Bock Ki Kim and Sook Kyoung Park in South Korea?

- Is your congregation studying the tenets of Anabaptist faith? Connect with groups in China, who are supported by resources developed together with George and Tobia Veith.
- What are the barriers to full participation for certain people in your congregation? Follow the example of Congolese Mennonite women who organized literacy training to boost female leadership in the church in DR Congo.
- Do you see the need for worshipping communities of peace where you live, like those whom Tom and Christine Poovong nurture in Thailand?

ORGANIZE AN EVENT

(Please keep in mind local guidelines and protocols for safety around COVID-19 as you plan.)

- Make a take-home kit for every family in your congregation that includes an information sheet on an international ministry or Witness workers, a snack from that region of the world as well as a craft or game.
- Use the resources in this document for International Witness Sunday. Take a special offering in your congregation for Mennonite Church Canada International Witness.
- Hold a serve-a-thon. Ask for sponsorship from your friends and family to do service tasks in your community. Pick up garbage, rake leaves, volunteer for a community service agency, deliver Meals-on-Wheels, etc. Post pictures and hours logged on your church Facebook page. Challenge others to join you. Serve locally and contribute to church work globally!
- Hold a fundraiser that is popular in your community.
 Give the proceeds to an International Witness program.
- Use your congregation's Facebook page to hold a trivia contest about the international ministry you support. Have the prize be a Zoom-call meal with International Witness workers and a meal delivered from a restaurant that serves food from that region. Look at the Mennonite Church Canada website, Witness worker newsletters and ask Witness workers to help with the trivia questions.



Across Mennonite Church Canada, congregations are connecting in life-giving ways through International Witness Support Networks. Your congregation is invited to participate!

How does it work?

Each network is a partnership between:

- your congregation and other congregations who wish to support the same ministry,
- your regional church
- Mennonite Church Canada,
- and our Witness workers.

Together, each network reaches out to international partners with the goal of nurturing mutually transformative relationships.

How can I be involved?

Congregations desire to be involved in various ways. The Witness Support Network Covenant (see page 9) suggests ways each member can contribute to their network. Discern together with your missions/service committee how you would like to participate. Each congregation's gifts are unique so every Network Covenant of support is unique.

Tasks for congregations change depending on the Witness

workers and area of ministry, but may include:

- distributing e-mails/printed newsletters written by Witness workers
- organizing annual fundraisers
- sending e-mails and encouragement to Witness workers
- contacting other congregations to encourage giving toward international ministries
- connecting with international partners online or in person through visits/learning tours
- sharing prayer requests with the larger church family and praying regularly.

Many of these are things congregations have already done for years. For this we are grateful!

Why is this important? We meet our priorities

Congregations supporting international ministry help meet the five priorities of Mennonite Church Canada international-ministry initiatives:

- 1. Generate financial support
- 2. Form and nurture relationships between Witness workers and supporters
- 3. Provide personal support and care for Witness workers
- 4. Create opportunities of congregational engagement
- 5. Nurture relationships with international partners.

We nurture sustainable support

Witness Support Networks allow congregations to



engage in international ministries in ways that are sustainable and meaningful for church members. Through the Networks, the congregation informs, inspires and connects with Witness workers to form relationships across political and ethnic borders through ministry together.

We connect our congregations

Congregations choose a representative to meet online with other representatives of other supporting congregations for encouragement and ideas. This forms important connections between congregations. Regional church staff and Mennonite Church Canada staff support you as you get to know each other. Witness workers may also attend meetings to get to know their supporting Canadian congregations.

George and Tobia Veith

George Veith develops teaching materials in Anabaptist theology, conflict transformation and discipleship for churches, seminaries and for the newly founded Anabaptist Resource Centre and the study groups that support it. Thailand

Tom and Christine Poovong

Focused on building self-sufficient congregations, Tom and Christine Poovong provide pastoral leadership to emerging Christian communities in northeastern Thailand. They have developed incomegenerating ministries, including MennoShoes and a mushroom farm, businesses where Christian disciples make a steady income and are able to give back to their local congregations. The goal is to establish self-sustainable, locally run peace churches. These churches have become part of a church-planting organization called Friends of Grace Church Association, which invites newly formed congregations to work together to support each other as they bless the communities where they live.

South Korea

Bock Ki Kim and Sook Kyoung Park

While a tiny minority within the larger Korean Christian community, Mennonite churches in Korea relate to each other through the formation of Mennonite Church South Korea. Bock Ki Kim and Sook Kyoung Park have been instrumental in the formation of this church body, while also church planting in Seoul.

Known as a peace-church pastor in a time where many Christians in Korea are eager to know more about biblical pacifism and conflict transformation, Bock Ki is called upon as a resource to the wider church on these topics. He participates in presentations and lectures as well as writing and translation. He has translated more than 30 books on Anabaptism and peace theology and helped found the Korean Anabaptist Journal. Sook Kyoung Park runs an after-school program, teaching English and peaceful education skills to children and youth.

Philippines

Dann and Joji Pantoja

The island of Mindanao is known as a conflict zone in the Philippines. It is also the home of PeaceBuilders Community Inc. (PBCI), founded by Dann and Joji Pantoja. PBCI provides peace-and-justice training for Christian church leaders, Indigenous leaders and civil society organizations. Their vision is that by the year 2025 each of the 81 provinces will have an established Peace and Reconciliation team.

As part of PBCI's sustainable development initiative, Joji works as CEO of Coffee for Peace, a social enterprise that works directly with local coffee farmers to ensure a fair return for their product and responsible environmental practices.
