There are other places in our community where people need healing. We think particularly of the families and communities so deeply affected by the finding of 215 children's bodies in unmarked graves at a residential school in Kamloops BC.

This sort of evil is incomprehensible, and yet it happened.

Help our country come to terms with this hard truth which is the only road we can take as we seek reconciliation with First Nations and Metis people.

We pray today also for those in our community who are missing fathers.

This pandemic has kept so many people apart from family, help us reach out to those who feel lonely.

Be with the sick and those who are in hospital or undergoing treatments.

For those who have lost fathers or other loved ones this year, we need your comfort.

God of fathers, who created fathers, who came as a child and had a father, God our Father, your love is deep and true: we are your children, forever and always. Amen.
