A Children's Christmas Play/Reading

Note: This simple script allows you to divide the speaking roles among as many readers as you wish. A delightful way to present this is to have children act out the scenes while the lines are being spoken. Enhance it further by including carols between the scenes.

Scene 1: Mary and Gabriel

A long, long, long time ago,
God sent one of his very special angels on a mission.
This angel's name was Gabriel.
Gabriel was sent to meet with a young woman, Mary.
God made sure that Gabriel knew how special Mary was. Gabriel was not to scare her, but to show Mary how much God loved her.
To prepare Mary for something God was about to do.
Would she want to be part of that plan?
That night, the angel Gabriel went to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to meet Mary.
"Mary, God loves you so very much! And is always with you!"
Mary had never met an angel before, so she was afraid.
So Gabriel started over again.
"Mary, don't be afraid, God loves you very much and is always with you."
"God has a plan to heal the world, and needs your help."
Mary listened closely. "How could this be?"
Gabriel continued,
"Even though you are not yet married to Joseph, you will have a son,"
"What?"
"And he will be known as the son of God."
Mary thought this was all impossible.
But Gabriel reminded Mary that Elizabeth, her elderly cousin, had also miraculously become pregnant.
