


"I will sing to the LORD,

The LORD is my strength and my might, and he has become my salvation; This is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him.






"The enemy said, 'I will pursue, I will overtake,

Sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea [Exodus 15:1b-2, 9-10, 21b]






Father God, we do not seek the destruction of our human enemies.

We want more; we seek control and dominance. We put our desires and appetites above others' needs. We claim exclusive control of the bounty you created for sharing.







