Parent – Child Dedication

Introduction:

Children are an incredible gift from God. To thank God for the gift of life Hannah and Elkannah took Samuel to the temple to dedicate him to God (I Samuel 24). Eli took care of Samuel and urged him to listen to God's voice. Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple to thank God for him (Luke 2:22-39). Anna and Simeon praised god for Jesus and saw glimpses of the fullness of God's salvation for the word. They were filled with joy and hope.

This morning these parents are bringing their children to worship. They come to dedicate themselves and their child to God, and to commit themselves to raising their child in the way of faith and faithful living. They come to thank god for a gift, and to ask God to give the gifts of faith to their child.

Invite the parents to come forward, while we sing – Jesus Loves the Little Children

To the congregation:

When parents bring their children for dedication, the church is being asked to do three things: to praise God in celebration of a birth, to assist the parents with prayer, support and counsel in their task of raising a child; and to welcome a child into the larger community of God's children, just as Jesus welcomed and blessed children.

Are you ready to praise God, and welcome these children? Will you, along with these parents, dedicate yourselves to the care and nurture of these little ones? Will you affirm these parents, and pledge your support in their role as Christian parents? If so, then answer in unison, "we will".

People: We will.

To the parents:

The birth of a child is a reminder to us, a sign of hope, that God is still at work in the world, taking care of things, creating newness, wonder, beauty and life.

In bringing your child here today, you are engaging in an act of worship – a recognition that ultimately, children are not our possession; they belong to God and are given to us as a





trust. We want to stand with you in this act of worship, and support you in the commitment you make.

It is your task as Christian parents to see that your child is instructed in the teachings of God's Word, the Bible, and the principles of faith. In every way, by word and deed, you are to lead your child to know the love of god and to have faith in Jesus Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Pastor to parents:

Will you accept your child as a gift from God? Will you commit yourselves to raising your child in an atmosphere of Christian love and nurture? Will you seek God's wisdom, patience, and playful spirit for your journey as parents? Will you dedicate yourselves and your child to the care and direction of God? If so, then answer in unison, "I will".

Parents: I will.
