
Children's Corner Resources for the library, home, Sunday School or Sunday morning storyteller.





Lamott takes us on a journey through her often troubled past to illuminate her devout but quirky walk of faith. In


a narrative spiced with stories and scripture, with diatribes, laughter, and tears, Lamott tells how, against all

Walking the Bible: A Journey by Land through the Five Books of



church musicians, congregational song leaders and students interested in learning the art of leading congregational singing.




Allen Sapp's Art: Through the Eyes of the Cree and Beyond


