
Fun Bible Skits 1, Faith and Life Resources, 2005. 25 ready-to-go biblical scripts and activities for children and congregations.





In this second resource his concerns are learning and teaching. How do people pick up new music? How do you encourage a congregation to learn a new song? How can you breathe new life into quality hymnody which has gone stale?





This book provides a hands-on approach to supervision, addressing key areas such as identifying a learning focus, covenanting, managing conflict, understanding and using power and authority, offering and receiving feedback and evaluation, and

celebrating and ending the supervisory relationship.



Peace Sermons 2007: By EMCers CD-ROM, edited by Terry M. Smith, Evangelical Mennonite Conference, 2007. The sermons in this collection were voluntarily submitted by ministers from the Evangelical Mennonite Conference (EMC). The messages reflect various shades of

meaning to peace. They also display diverse styles of speaking, outlining, and writing.



Tribal Church: Ministering to the Missing Generation by Carol Howard Meritt, Alban Institute, 2007. Many churches are seeking ways to reach out to the younger generations. Unfortunately this often manifests as either a "come be just like us!" attitude, or as a slick marketing campaign. Both of these approaches often leave young adults feeling that their particular

spiritual gifts and needs are unwanted by the church. Outlining the financial, social, and familial situations that affect many young adults today, the author describes how intergenerational churches can provide a safe, supportive place for young adults to nurture relationships and foster spiritual growth.




Simply Enough: Straight Talk from Tony Campolo and Shane Claiborne on Simple, Just Living, DVD, Alternatives for Simple Living, 2007. Campolo and Claiborne have created an intensely personal dialogue about the foundations of the Christian life and voluntary simplicity. Contains segments on lifestyle, food, celebrations, stuff, money and justice. Includes study/action guide.



Learning God's Stories Together: Intergenerational Program for Church and Home, by Dorothy Henderson, Wood Lake Publishing, 2007. Includes both theory for "allages learning" and 20 story sessions to help apply it to your setting. Each session contains suggestions for gathering, for telling and talking about

the story, and for exploring the story and making it part of your life.



The Biblical World: An Illustrated Atlas, by Jean-Pierre Isbouts, National Geographic, 2007. Magnificently illustrated with photographs, maps, timelines and side-bars, this book encompasses the entire history of the Holy Land - from the dawn of human civilization to the 7th century C.E., from Abraham's

first appearance through the evolution and spread of Judaism, Christianity and Islam.








The Purple Crown: The Politics of Martyrdom by Tripp York, Herald Press, 2007. Exhibits how Christianity's ultimate act of witnessing, martyrdom, is an inherently political act. York argues that the path of Christianity leads to a confrontation with the same powers that crucified Jesus.



Send Forth Your Light: A Vision for Peace, Mission and Worship, by Willard Swartley, Herald Press, 2007. Swartley develops a biblical theology of peacemaking and witness to the powers. He draws on both Old and New Testaments to address two controversial topics: payment of taxes used to support war-making and what the Bible teaches about Israel.



Proclamation by Design: The Visual Arts in Worship by Karmen Krahn and Leslie James, Faith and Life Resources, 2007. The authors tell us why and how visual art is an indispensable part

of telling the Story of God as found in the Bible. They bring pictures and stories of good visual art at work in worship.

Statistics and Dreams

I'm writing this *Resource Update* as I return to the Resource Centre for a New Year. It's allowed time for some reflection:

I am grateful for:

- The numerous emails of encouragement and calls of appreciation as we work together to resource our congregations and families.
- Continued increase in circulation of resources. 2007 was a record year – 5% higher volume circulation than 2006.
- The 129 congregations (up from 106) that we had direct contact with this past year, 66% of whom were from outside Manitoba.
- A growing awareness of our online catalogue: electronic loan orders are up 53% from 2006 and Mennonite Publishing Network e-commerce sales are up 59%.
- Partnerships with other Mennonite resource providers: Mennonite Publishing Network, Cascadia Publishing House, Mennonite Foundation of Canada, Pandora Press, SmallTall Music. Each organization provides all of their products through our Centre for a free preview loan. And more partnerships are in the works!
- 27,431 downloads! This number, too, details a growing volume of traffic to our catalogue. It's a free and accessible way to locate MC Canada materials or an original resource From Our Churches.

I look ahead to 2008 and am excited about:

- Our dream to develop a "Resource Consortium:"
 a "union-catalogue" with Columbia Bible College
 Resource Library, Mennonite Brethren in Christ
 Resource Centre, and Mennonite Church Eastern
 Canada Resource Library. This would provide a
 convenient way of searching all 4 databases from any
 of our websites.
- Our recently appointed team of Resource Advocates

 one from each Area Church. They will be meeting in Elmira, ON, January 31-February 2, and be equipped to serve as liaisons between congregations and the Resource Centre. More information will be forthcoming in the next Resource Update.
- Travel in the next months that will take me to meetings in Ontario, seminars in Saskatchewan, and a retreat in Alberta. I look forward to meeting some of you during workshops, worship or around the display table.
- Continued partnership in your local ministries whether we meet in person, talk by phone or email, or communicate on our website.
