


Words for Worship by Arlene Mark, Herald Press, 1995. This collection of prayers,





problems? Wallis helps us rediscover our moral center and provides both the needed inspiration and a concrete plan to hold politics accountable and find solutions to our greatest challenges.



In 1969, Ann-Marie Dornn's parents did the unthinkable. They left a Hutterite colony near Portage la Prairie, Manitoba with seven children and little else, to start a new life. This book chronicles her quest to reinvent herself as she comes to terms with the painful circumstances that led her

family to leave community life.


Imagined Homes: Soviet German Immigrants in Two Cities by Hans Werner, University of Manitoba Press, 2007. Employing a cross-national comparative framework, Hans Werner reveals that the process of integration into a new urban environment was greatly influenced by how the immigrants imagined their settlement experiences would be. Winnipeg's migrants chose a receiving society

where they knew they would again be a minority group in a foreign country, while Bielefeld's newcomers believed they were "going home" and were unprepared for the conflict between their imagined homeland and the realities of post-war Germany.

2008. This book offers a fresh
and up-to-date look at the seven
core beliefs, and the practices
that have developed from them,
held by Mennonite-related groups
around the world today. Writing
as a member from the Southern
Hemisphere, the author brings a
fresh view to a movement that for

400 plus years was active primarily in Europe and North America (the majority of the members now live in the Global South).

Through the Red Gate DVD, Out to See Entertainment, 2008. Peter Bargen was just seven years old when he and his family narrowly escaped the Russian Gulag and an almost certain death. The rest of his relatives were not so fortunate. During Stalin's reign (1922-53), thousands of Mennonites, along with 45-60 million people perished through enforced exile, execution, famine, and resulting disease.

Now, in a story that crosses continents and binds together generations, a rare and long forgotten cache of letters reveals the terrifying details of his family's fate.

How did the number of Christians in the world grow from as few as 25,000 one hundred years after Christ's death to up to 20 million in AD 310? How did the Chinese underground church grow from 2 million to over 100 million in sixty years despite considerable opposition? The author reveals the

paradigmatic insights he discovered as he delved into those questions and translates these findings into the context of the contemporary Western church.

Wrestling with the Text: Young Adult Perspectives on Scripture by Keith Graber Miller and Malinda Elizabeth Berry, 2007. Through its reporting of young adults wrestling anew with the Bible, this volume marks an important occasion of and for Mennonite conversation about identity and

scriptural authority. When Jacob wrestled with God's messenger in Genesis, he did not let go until he received a blessing. So Jacob was renamed Israel, or "God Wrestles." A theme uniting this book's 16 stories plus responses is this reality of wrestling in search of blessing.



Seeking Peace in Africa: Stories from African Peacemakers edited by Donald E. Miller, et al., 2007. The stories in this volume are the hopeful responses of Africans who have lived through horrific violence. Some are unbearable tales of despair at the loss of millions of lives due to

warfare, riots, terror, starvation, AIDS and disease. Others are remarkable descriptions of courageous peacemaking in the midst of nearly impossible circumstances.



family groups, tiny clusters of congregations, and churches of many ethnicities and languages.



States of Exile: Visions of Diaspora, Witness and Return by Alain Epp Weaver, Herald Press, 2008. Offers a political theology of exile which envisions diaspora and return as both integral dimensions of the church's witness for the shalom of the city. Unlike conventional views, the author envisions the Christian

church as a community in exile which must learn to be theologically "not in charge." The church in exile, he argues, must cultivate a receptiveness to the inbreaking of God's Spirit from beyond its walls.
