






Blessed Connections: Relationship that Sustain Vital Ministry by Judith A. Schwanz, Alban Institute, 2008. No pastor sets out to fail, but statistics say 15 to 20 percent of pastors leave pastoral ministry within the first five years. One seminary administrator said that every person he had heard of leaving the ministry had done so because of a relationship failure. We cannot escape relationships in ministry,

yet few seminaries offer courses in how to build healthy relationships. In Blessed Connections, the author focuses on the person of the minister and the relational system of the minister's life.








Knitting into the Mystery: A Guide to the Shawl-Knitting Ministry by Susan S. Jorgensen; Susan S. Izard, Morehouse Publishing, 2003. Knitters are part of a tradition that's both plainly practical and deeply spiritual. This tradition is flowering today through knitting ministries, a

worldwide ecumenical movement of women's groups, gathering to pray and knit for those in need and those celebrating life's joys. This book offers directions for knitting the shawls and for starting a church or community knitting ministry. It also provides a selection of prayers, written from many faith traditions, to offer with each completed shawl.

of stewardship, it also discusses how one's talents, time, finances, and relationships relate to the care of creation.








We Bear the Loss Together: A History of the Mennonite Aid Union, 1866-2007 by Laureen Harder, Pandora Press, 2007. Formed in 1866, the Mennonite Aid Union of Ontario was the first Mennonite mutual aid organization in North America. Rejecting both the stock and mutual models for insurance companies, MAU insisted on

holding no surplus and collecting no premiums in its early years. Its resolve to bear its members' burdens together without regulation or resort to the courts led it at times into conflict with government, insurance companies, financial institutions, the Mennonite church, and its own membership. However, its unusual method of operation also garnered it respect from both individuals and institutions.
