





How long may I borrow a resource?

We have different loan periods to accommodate mail service and resource demand. The typical loan period for a book or DVD is 4 weeks. We shorten that to 3 weeks (2 weeks within Winnipeg) for new resources, seasonal materials (Christmas), or partner resources ("preview" loans). We lengthen the loan period for a video series that runs for 6+ sessions. When ordering online, our software's default due date is 4 weeks. We will (or you may) adjust those dates according to the restrictions above.


